Legal Context

This annual report complies with Schedule 1 Part 4(h) of the Forestry Management Contract between AgriWealth Pty Limited and the Forestry Commission of New South Wales (Forests NSW) for the AgriWealth Plantation Investment 2006 Softwood Project, dated 21 June 2006.

Overview

The 2006 Radiata Pine Project is located 3 kilometres west of Batlow on the property known as Hansen. The 2007 age class has been successfully established and the trees are growing well.

Rainfall in has been well above average during the reporting period, with significant rainfall events during spring and summer. This period of above average rainfall has resulted in generally good tree growth for all plantation areas. Total rainfall at Tumbarumba from July 11 to June 12 was 1214 mm compared to the long term average of 980mm.

Stand Condition

The plantation has responded well to the above average rainfall with noticeable growth since the last report.

Blackberry and bracken regrowth remains widespread, and while this provides some competition to the early growth, it is apparent that the young trees have grown through the undergrowth and have established site dominance. Observations indicate that the plantation establishment continues to be successful.
